COLLEGE PROFILE

The Gossaigaon College is the only Provincialised degree College imparting higher education to all the students of entire Gossaigaon civil sub-division since its establishment in 1971. The primary aim of the College is to provide higher education to the deprived and economically downtrodden section of the society and to empower them to get employment in various sectors and to develop good citizens.

The College is situated in a vast area 9.73 hectares of land purely in a rural set up with adequate infra structural facilities to run the existing courses. The beautifully grown sal trees (Shorea robusta) on its northen side immenely glorifies the campus and provides a peaceful and naturally conducive atmosphere for all teaching-learning processes. Since its humble beginning in 1971, the College is marching ahead against all odds and has reached the present position. In the beginning, altogether eight departments were introduced in the Arts Stream with more addition in the later stage. The college authority has also taken a bold initiative by introducing Science Streams having affiliation to Bodoland University. The hard work and strong determination of the College authority was able to bring the institution under deficit grant-in-aid system in 1978 and also obtained recognitions from the UGC under section 2(f) and 12(b) of the UGC Act.(1956) in the year 1990. Subsequently, the College has been brought under provincialised system by Government of Assam in 2005.

The post Graduate (PG) course in Geography and Economics has also been introduced at gossaigaon College with intake capacity of twenty(20) student each subject per semester from the academic session 2017-18.

Free wifi access has been provided to the students, teachers and staffs to access eresources in the college campus. Keeping in view of the growing demand of the society, automated functioning of college administration has been initiated using the ICT resources from the academic session 2017-18. The current admission has been set to go cashless. Apart from this, the college has been brought under CCTV surveillance system since 2018.

With its limited resources the college has ably faced two successive cycles of NAAC assessments, the first cycle being in the year 2004 and the second cycle in 2016. The indicators in both these assessments hint towards upliftment of quality education with modern facilities which the College is still striving for.

In order to achieve academic excellence, the College authority is endeavoring to tap the co-operative moods of all teaching and non-teaching staff of the College. During the pandemic of Covid -19 special online classes were taken for Major Students. Over the years, the College has achieved success in improving the academic atmosphere in the right perspective. Apart from imparting academic teaching to the students, the College also organizes remedial classes as well as coaching classes for entry into various like Civil Service, Banking, Assam Public Service Commission, Railways, TET etc. with the financial assistance received from UGC time to time.

Apart from this, students are also provided opportunities to participate in co-curricular activities through the NCC and NSS unit of the College. The NCC unit of the College is largely vibrant in all its activities including participation in Republic Day Parade, National Integration Camp, Mountaineering Camp etc. held every year in various places and also achieved success with many awards. Many cadets hailing from poor families have got placements in various defense services. As a whole, the College has been able to harness the good talents of the students in co-curricular activities which is reflected in the success stories achieved in various tournaments organized by Guahati University i.e. Inter College Football Tournament on several occasions.

The establishment of Gossaigaon College in the year 1971 was the realization of the hopes and aspirations of thousands of well wishers that aimed at providing higher education to the downtrodden people of this neglected backward area in the State of Assam. The institution has passed through many ups and downs during its journey from 1971. The last 49 years of struggle have bore fruits today which could be witnessed from the services of out going students rendered to the society. We have a long cherished vision to accomplish in the future and reiterates our resolve and determination to transform them into reality to enable the institution to achieve new heights of excellence.


GENERAL INFORMATIONS & INFRASTRUCTURE

01. LIBRARY:

The Gossaigaon College Library started simultaneously with the establishment of the College in the year 1971. It was housed in one of the halls of the present Academic Block constructed with the assistance received from the UGC during the 8th plan. Later on, the Library was shifted to its present location just near the Administrative Building of the College in the year 2008. The Gossaigaon College Library was later on renamed Amritlal Basumatary Memorial Library after the name of the founder Principal of the College. The Library has a good collection of books, Journals, Magazines, Employment News & News paper in English, Assamese, Bodo & Hindi. It has more than 21253 copies of texts and other reference books and it remains open from 9.00 AM to 4.00 PM on all working days. The Library provides a reading room for students as well as for teachers within the building. It also provides book bank facility and xerox facilities to the students. The college has installed an ICT Lab in the newly constructed library to access UGC-inflibnet, NDL, N-list, database and other e-resources available for the students.









02. THE COLLEGE UNIFORM AND IDENTITY CARD:

The Gossaigaon College has its own prescribed college dress code and identity card for the students. All the students must come in their recommended uniform except on Wednesday with formal dresses and wear their identity card inside the college campus.

03. STUDENTS UNION:

The Students Union of the College is constituted every year and as per the rules and regulation of the Bodoland University. The G.C.S.U carries out various activities for the welfare of the college. It also organizes various events every year such as games & sports, debates, quiz, cultural competitions etc. for providing scope to the students to show their talents in respective fields.

04. BODO STUDENTS LITERARY SOCIETY:

The Gossaigaon College Bodo Students' Literary Society (GCBSLS) provides scope to the Bodo student community for expressing their ideas and views through writing and participating in various literary activities. The Society is constituted involving the Bodo teachers and the Bodo students of the College. It organizes literary competitions such as seminars, workshops, debates, quiz etc. The GCBSLS also participates in the literary programmes organized by other colleges.



05. STUDENTS AID FUND:

The college has students' Aid Funds and there is a provision for helping the poor and needy students of the college at the time of filling up of form for various College Examinations.

6. AWARDS:

(a) HARIKISHAN AGARWALA AWARD:

This award is instituted in Honour of donor member Late Harikishan Agarwala and is given to the students securing the highest aggregate marks in the H.S. final examination separately for Arts & Science Stream every year.

(b) COLLEGE AWARD:

This award is given to students securing the highest marks in the B.A./B.Sc. final examination every year in both Arts & Science Stream.

(c) G.C.S.U. AWARD:

This award is institute by G.C.S.U. of the college to be given to the best cadet of N.C.C. in the form trophy every year.

07. HOSTEL FACILITIES:

Limited hostel seats with normal facilities are being provided for both boys and girls. Both the hostels are storied buildings located in serene surroundings on a separate campus within the College premises. The girl's hostel accommodate about 50 students while the boy's hostel has the capacity to accommodate about 30 students. All the rooms are double bedded and well furnished with separate dining hall and attached common reading room. The college also provides hostel facilities for P.G. students. (Boys & Girls). For smooth functioning of the hostels, a set of important rules and regulations are framed which are to be strictly followed by the boarders to maintain the discipline and integrity of the hostels. Every possible effort has been made by the College authority to provide all inmates a peaceful, calm and homely environment required to pursue their academic goal.





- **08. LABORATORY FACILITIES:** The College has well equipped departmental laboratory facilities as per the needs of the various courses under the Bodoland University both in Arts and Science streams. The existing lab of Geography dept. has been upgraded to PG lab by the B.U. from the academic session 2017-18.
- **9. CANTEEN FACILITY:** The College has a Canteen facility to cater to the needs of students, faculties, office staffs and others a like at normal rate.
- **10. SEMINAR HALL:** The College has a standard air conditioned hall with appreciable sitting arrangement meant for the conduct of digital interactions between the students and the faculties. The hall is well equipped with projection tools and audio system for the smooth routing of any congregation on any given occasion.
- 11. BICYCLE STAND: Two sheds for keeping the bicycle of the students have been provided within the college campus. Further, it is planned to construct more BiCycle stand garage to facilitate the staff and the students to keep their vehicles, bikes and Scooties.
- **12. SBI ATM COUNTER:** An SBI ATM facility has been provided within the college campus in collaboration with SBI Gossaigaon Branch to facilitate the students, teachers and others.
- **13. CAREER COUNSELING CELL:** A career counseling cell is located within the college campus to facilitate the students to know more about various job opportunities and their placements around the global as per guide lines.
- **14. DEPARTMENTAL LIBRARY:** Every Department in the college maintains a separate departmental library to facilitate students for easy and quick references. Students are also allowed to borrow books from the departmental library for a very short period.
- **15. PREVENTION AND PROHIBITION OF RAGGING:** As per directives of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in SPL No. 24295, dated, 16-05-2007 and in Civil Appeal No. 887 of 2009, dated, 08/05/2009- All the student of Gossaigaon College are hereby informed that-

The NSS unit of the college holds summer and winter camps by selecting remote and backward villages in and around the college as part of extension education activities. The idea behind organizing such programmes is to include a sense of responsibility, discipline and work culture amongst the students.

The College also organize extension education programme in the local educational institutions and the village with the resources generated locally by involving teachers, students and guardians to bring awareness among the people of the locality about the importance of education and other burning issues.

The National Cadet Corps (NCC) is a national organization, which helps the cadets in inculcating a spirit of unity, courage, confidence, selfless service, a feeling of patriotism, faith in onself and power of thought, which are essential to make the youth a disciplined citizen of the nation. The NCC Units is affiliated to the 7 Assam Bn. NCC, Dhubri. Since its inception in 2001, the NCC unit of the college has passed through many stages to reach its present position. So far many cadets have qualified and passed in the B & C certificate examinations. Our Cadets had been selected for various camps, such as Combined Annual Training camp, National Integration camp, Camel Safari, Army Attachment camp, RDC in Delhi, mountaineering etc. The NCC unit of the college has adopted has adopted a village located about 5 kms away from the college with the support of the college authority. Offlate, an L.P. school has also been started to provide education to the poor children of the village Ghugujhora.

CODE OF CONDUCT-DISCIPLINE TOP PRIORITY:

To foster a safe and protective campus community and ensure non-threatening environment that advances the mission of the college, the authority has come up with following 'code of conducts' for the students. Accordingly, students will be held responsible for any breach of college regulations and within this context, appropriate efforts will be made to foster the personal and social development of the students. Failure to adhere rules could lead the college authority to initiate student disciplinary action.

Mandatory:

- 1. Violation of rules, irregular attendance, unsatisfactory progress and non-clearance of fees, showing discourtesy to the faculty and staff members in any form, adoption of unfair means during examination are some of the offences which may make the students liable for disciplinary actions and even expulsion. Ragging is strictly prohibited within the college campus and any one found involved in it will invite strong action against himself/herself as per the directives of the Supreme Court of India.
- 2. A student must appear in all the examinations conducted by the college and a minimum attendance of 75% is mandatory to be eligible to appear in the semester examinations.
- 3. The courses offered by the Gossaigaon College are full time courses. No student is allowed to be engaged in any other courses or jobs simultaneously.
- 4. It is mandatory for all students to follow the dress code prescribed by the College authority.
- 5. Mobile phones should be kept in switch-off mode while in the classroom.
- 6. All Students must come in their recommended uniform except on Wednesdays but with formal dress and wear their identity card inside the college campus.
- 7. Any student found guilty of tampering of damaging the property of college shall be liable to severe punishment and may invite expulsion from the college and the student will have to repay for all such damages as deemed fit by the College authority.
- 8. All Power of maintenance of discipline are vested with the college authority and decision of the college authority shall be final in all concerned cases.
- 9. The College authority shall take no responsibility for students' behavior or acts outside its premises. However, complaints on any such activities if received that is harmful to the reputation of the college, then the college authority shall have the right to initiate necessary steps against the students.
