Title of the Paper, Name of the Author/Co-author, Designation, Institution, Email ID, Contact number within 300-350 words with maximum 5 (five) keywords.

Full Paper Submission:

Full paper of individual paper presenter is to be submitted within the specified date as mentioned below. The full paper for publication should contain Introduction, Review of Literature, Objectives, Methodology, Discussion, Results/Findings, Policy Implications and Conclusion. References should be given at the end of the paper arranged alphabetically by authors, followed by the year of publications, name of the journals, articles or books, etc., name of the publishers, place of publications and relevant pages in succession. The full paper should be 2500 - 3000 words without abstract. The full paper (2500-3000 words) is to be submitted to paper4internationals.gc@gmail.com

Accommodation:

Accommodation could be arranged to the paper presenters on request in Hotels at Gossaigaon, Kokrajhar, Bongaigaon, Coochbehar and Alipurduar, but they will have to bear the expenses. The Hotel rents are affordable. Alternatively, they can arrange their accommodation directly. The Organizing Committee will announce the lists of the recommended Hotels later. No TA/DA will be provided to the participants except the invited resource persons.

Climate of Gossaigaon in August:

The temperature in August generally reaches a high of about 32°C during the daytime and the average minimum temperature comes down to 26°C at night. The relative humidity level is about 78% for the same period.

Nearest Airports:

The nearest Airports are Lokpriya Gopinath Bordoloi International Airport, Guwahati and Bagdogra Airport, Siliguri which are not more than two hours journey by air from Delhi. These Airports are also connected to Mumbai, Kolkata, Chennai and other Airports in India and Abroad.

Nearest Railway Stations:

The nearest Railway stations suggested are New Bongaigaon, Kokrajhar, New Coochbehar and New Alipurduar which are well connected with most of the cities and towns in India by trains. Those who want to reach Gossaigaon by train can also avail of Brahmaputra Mail, Kanchan Junga Express, Jaja Express, Lumding Intercity, Kamakhya-New Coochbehar Intercity, Dekargaon(Tezpur)-NJP Intercity and Sifung Passenger which have stoppage at Gossaigaon Hat station.

Profile of the College:

Gossaigaon College is the only institution of higher learning in the Gossaigaon Civil Sub-Division of Kokrajhar District in Assam. Established in the year 1971, Gossaigaon College has progressed by leaps and bounds against heavy odds discharging its sacred mission "to meet the aspirations of higher education of the local people mostly the tribals, to promote women education and to provide science education at minimum costs in order to bring about an around development of the area as a whole".

The College is located about 50 km away towards the west of Kokrajhar, the Headquarter of Bodoland Territorial Council (BTC) of Assam. The beautiful natural sal trees which stand gloriously by the side of the College provide a peaceful and cordial atmosphere for teaching and learning process.

"Gender and Development: A Global Perspective"

Thematic Rationale:

Gender is not a synonymous for 'women' in fact its focus is on the equal relations between men and women. Gender equality advocates have been at the forefront of efforts to democratize power relations in private and informal institutions as well as in the public sphere.

Women's lives are changing for the better, but not fast enough and as yet, not well-entrenched. The particular extreme poverty characteristic features of developing countries like Afghanistan, Indonesia, Rwanda accentuated by conflict, natural disasters and structural weaknesses further complicate the efforts to improve the situation for women. Gender inequality gets further exacerbated in conflict situations. The lack of economic rights is common in many developing countries and this systematically disempowers women. Women are not able to scale up production and break out of the cycle of poverty. Many women also do not necessarily benefit from the changing global trade environment which further pushes them into marginal economic activities. Women's participation in the political arena, although growing, does not always translate into improved capacity to effect substantive difference in policy and agenda setting which recommends the role of women.

According to Kofi Annan (2002), "Sustainable, Peace and Security will not be achieved without women's full and equal participation". Women and Women organizations all over the world have risked their lives to address human rights issues, to make their voice heard in peace negotiation and to organize demonstration as a means to gain political influence after conflict.

In the coming years, more fruitful effective and meaningful partnerships between developing countries and their development partners including United Nation agencies, other multilateral organizations, non-governmental organizations, civil society and the private sector will play a vital role in realizing the goals of the *inter alia*, as they relate to women and girls. It's all about empowering and development of women socially, legally, politically and economically and providing peace and security.

To achieve gender equality and empower all women and girls is one of the major goals for sustainable development. Therefore, the organizing the International Seminar on "Gender and Development" is a very important platform to hear global initiatives, issues, challenges and achievements.
