

Observation from the students' feedback across Arts departments:

From the above table it is found that 29.7% of students are agree with the course content, 48.8% are agree with the syllabus and curriculum, 48.6% are agree with the staff involvement, 45.9% are strongly agree with the teaching resources provided to them and 46.2% are agree with the teaching methodology.



Observation from the students' feedback across Science departments:

From the above table it is found that 45.0% of students are agree with the course content, 47.1% are agree with the syllabus and curriculum, 44.5% are agree with the staff involvement, 43.8% are agree with the teaching resources provided to them, 43.5% are agree with the teaching methodology and 32.8% are agree with the experimental learning.

However, 2.5% of students are disagree with the course content, 3.8% are disagree with the syllabus and curriculum, 1.8% are disagree with the staff involvement, 1.7% are disagree with the teaching resources provided to them, 6.1% are disagree with the teaching methodology and 30.3% are disagree with the experimental learning.

Actions Taken:

- 1. Design of experiments, workshops and scope for learning are to be encouraged. Towards this, the departments were advised to coordinate with IQAC to conduct these programmes.
- 2. Teachers should discuss the topics in detail with clear practical live examples of the contents in their subject.

The IQAC of the college collected feedbacks regarding the facilities and qualities related to the curriculum deliveries, infrastructures, administrative functioning, qualities of teachers, cooperation from faculties and office staff, library facilities and overall environment of the institution. Feedbacks collected from six different stake holders viz- students, teachers, employees, parents, alumni and employers were analyzed, summary report prepared and presented as below:

BASED ON FEEDBACK FROM STUDENTS

The driving force behind the procedure of feedback is the reflective of transforming constructive suggestions to concrete steps. Feedbacks from students are taken which enables the college to make efforts to bring about the changes. Few noteworthy points emerged from the feedback given by the students of the college are as mentioned below-

Feedback on teaching faculties:

The respondent were given detailed questionnaires about various qualities of the teacher like- responsiveness, punctuality, subject knowledge, adequacy of teaching materials, course completion, communication skill and on overall performances. The respondent data were grouped in two categories i.e. Arts stream and Science stream for convenience of analysis.

It is found that 29.3% of arts students strongly agreed with the course content, 29.7% simply agreed, 17.1% responded neutral, where as 3.2% responded as disagree. On the matter of syllabus and curriculum, 31% strongly agreed, 48.8% simply agreed, 17.3% neutral while 2.9% strongly disagreed. Regarding the faculty's involvement for academic advices 33.7% respondent strongly agreed, 48.6% agreed, 14.9% remained neutral, while 2.7% showed as disagreeable. On the matters of teaching resources 45.9% responded strongly agreeable, 39.1% responded as agreeable while 13% remained neutral and 0.1% showed disagreeable. Relating to teaching methodology applied by the faculty 37.6% students strongly agreed, 46.2% showed agreeable, 37.5% responded as neutral while 2.7% showed disagree. Overall, 35.5% arts stream students strongly agreed with these 5 parameters while only 3.32% showed as disagreeable and none of the arts stream respondents reacted to strongly disagree.




Fig.1: Depicting students' feedback across Arts stream departments

Pooled data from Science stream respondents depicted 35.3% strongly agree with the course content, 45% simply agreed, 17.1% responded neutral, where as 2.5% responded as disagree. On the matter of syllabus and curriculum, 26.5% strongly agreed, 47.1% agreed, 22.5% neutral while 3.8% strongly disagreed. On the faculty's' involvement for academic advices 38.4% respondent strongly agreed, 44.5% agreed, 16.5% remained neutral, while 1.8% showed as disagreeable. Relating to the matters of teaching resources 42.2% responded strongly agreeable, 43.8% responded as agreeable while 12.2% remained neutral and 1.7% showed disagreeable. Relating to teaching methodology applied by the faculty 37.7% students strongly agreed, 43.5% showed agreeable, 12.7% responded as neutral while 6.1%

reacted as disagreeable. Regarding the experimental learning 26.5% students responded as strongly agree, 32.8% reacted agreeable, 20.1% responded neutral, while 30.3% responded disagree and 8.1% as strongly disagree. Overall, 34.4% Science stream students strongly agreed with these 6 parameters while some 8.1% showed as strongly disagreeable which is found to be because of experimental learning thereby, indicating unhappiness over the practical facilities provided by the institution that needs an urgent care




Fig.2: Depicting students' feedback across Science stream departments

Regarding the course objectives, clarity and syllabus coverage by teaching faculties, approximately 91% respondents said yes and some 9% objected. On the effectiveness of teachers in the matters of technical content delivery 55% rated as good, 27% as average and some 9% as excellent.

On the matter of communication skill of teachers 35% said excellent, 55% as good and 3% poor. On the use of non-print teaching aids around 56% remarked as good, 20% as excellent, 15% average, 5% as neutral and 3% as poor. Regarding the availability of teaching faculty beyond the normal classes and their co-operation in solving individual problems approximately 55% of students responded as good, 28% excellent, 12% average, 3% remained neutral while 3% responded as poor.

With regards to overall effectiveness of the departments and the college environment around 56% responded against good, 29% excellent, 11% average while around 3% each preferred poor and neutral. With regards to lab facilities around 21% responded against excellent, 20% as good, 11% as average, 26% remarked poor.

Regarding the resources of learning materials in the library and other facilities, some 13% responded as excellent, 16% good, 21% average 26% neutral while 25% said poor.

Regarding the canteen facilities 21% reacted as excellent, 18% good, 28% said poor and some 19% remained neutral.

On the matter of hostel facilities in the college around 15% respondent said excellent, 15% good, 23% average and some 30% of students remained neutral.

With regards to the college campus and the overall environment 17% of the respondent remarked as excellent, 30% remained neutral, 20% respondent said good while 18% said poor college campus.

In the area of presentation of concepts and ideas, approximately 34% students responded strongly agreeable, 37% responded agreeable, 27% as neutral, 2% as disagreeable and none posted as strongly disagreeable.

Some observations and suggestions:

- 1. Expansion of parking facilities for both faculty and students may be made.
- 2. Improvement of washroom and drinking water facilities needed.
- 3. Food quality and number of varieties in the canteen need improvement.
- 4. Well being facilities for all stake holders.

BASED ON FEEDBACK FROM ALUMNI

Alumni feedback offer important perspectives for evaluating academic programs and student services. They provide us the inputs regarding improvement in facilities and employability of our students. We appeal our alumni to provide their sincere feedback on curriculum. We have received alumni feedback on syllabus and curriculum. The alumni were highly satisfied in the course objectives and the workload was also manageable by the students. Based on the response of the alumni, the analysis is done as follows.

It is noticed from the Table-4, that on an average 49.4% agree with the problem solving and communication skill, 45.9% simply agree with the leadership quality, 33.7% agree with the faculty support, 39% strongly agreed with the infrastructure facility and 30.8% strongly agreed with the employability focus

However, on an average 5.8% are disagreed with the problem solving and communication skill, 8.7% simply disagree with the leadership quality, some 14.5% disagree with the faculty support, 4.7% are disagreed with the infrastructure facility and 13.4% are disagree with the employability focus.




Fig.3: Depicting alumni feedback

BASED ON FEEDBACK FROM PARENTS

The feedback from parents is collected to understand the students' education and activities in and around department. We have received the total feedback from the parents on the current content of the syllabus that has helped student's future. Analysis of the feedback received from the parents is done as follows:

It is seen from the Table-5, that around 44.7% parents agreed with the discipline in the college, 35.3% simply agree with the ambience for students, 38.7% agreed with the improvement in language and attitude of students, 38.7% are strongly agreed with the syllabus framed for student upliftment and 44.7% are agreed that the syllabus greatly helps in recruitment.

However, 7.3% are disagreed with the discipline in the college, 13.3% with the ambience for students, 14.6% with the improvement in language and attitude of students, 10.0% are disagreed with the syllabus framed for student upliftment and 3.3% are disagreed that the syllabus greatly helps in recruitment.




Fig.4: Depicting parents' feedback

BASED ON FEEDBACK FROM EMPLOYEES

The employee feedback is valuable as it provides inputs regarding the improvement in facilities and employability of our students. We have collected feedback from the employees where we asked our employees to respond on the curriculum. They felt that the curriculum higher learning and applied learning.

It is seen from the Table-6 that 50.% of alumni agrees with the availability of teaching resources, 44.6% agree will support in higher learning, 32.1% agree with the career orientation and advanced topics, 50.0% agree with the clarity of course objectives and 57.1% agree that curriculum will ensures moral ethics and professional attitude.

However, 10.7% employees are disagreed with the availability of teaching resources, 14.3% disagree with the support in higher learning, 19.6% are disagreed with the career orientation on advanced topics, 8.9% are disagreed with the clarity of course objectives.




Fig.5: Depicting employees' feedback

- 1. Majority of the employers expressed satisfaction over punctuality observed by our students employed with them. The committee took the observation on record.
- 2. The feedbacks be shared to the respective Heads of the Department in order to encourage the students to be even more focused.
- 3. Professionals may be brought to the campus for wider exposure.




Fig.6: Depicting employers' feedback

On the overall response and humble suggestions

The driving force behind the procedure of feedback is the reflective of transforming constructive suggestions to concrete steps. Feedbacks from students and other stakeholders are taken which enables the college to make efforts to bring about constructive changes. Majority students opined that syllabus was completed on time by teachers. Various parameters such as delivery of technical content, communication skills, use of non-print teaching aids and availability beyond normal classes and co-operation to solve individual problems were praised and expressed satisfaction by respondents. Majority students express satisfaction on lab facilities. To meet 100% students' satisfaction, the college authority feels improvements on existing facilities are needed. The library facilities earned highest rating as it could attract more students by its existing facilities, equipped with ILMS and web browsing facilities has resolved the long standing grievances of the students. The college infrastructure facilities and services satisfied the students and further suggestion for improvement of college building and beautification of college campus are politely suggested by many respondents.
