Students Feedback:



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Observation from the students' feedback across Arts departments:

From the above table it is found that 29.7% of students are agree with the course content, 48.8% are agree with the syllabus and curriculum, 48.6% are agree with the staff involvement, 45.9% are strongly agree with the teaching resources provided to them and 46.2% are agree with the teaching methodology.

However, 3.2% of students are disagree with the course content, 2.9% are disagree with the syllabus and curriculum, 2.7% are disagree with the staff involvement, 0.1% are disagree with the teaching resources provided to them and 2.7% are disagree with the teaching methodology.

Actions Taken:

1. The teachers were advised to focus more on active learning where the students are given an opportunity to express their talents and have some fun time and make learning more enjoyable.

2. All teachers have to cover the entire syllabus as per the course plan scheduled.



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Observation from the students' feedback across Science departments:

From the above table it is found that 45.0% of students are agree with the course content, 47.1% are agree with the syllabus and curriculum, 44.5% are agree with the staff involvement, 43.8% are agree with the teaching resources provided to them, 43.5% are agree with the teaching methodology and 32.8% are agree with the experimental learning.

However, 2.5% of students are disagree with the course content, 3.8% are disagree with the syllabus and curriculum, 1.8% are disagree with the staff involvement, 1.7% are disagree with the teaching resources provided to them, 6.1% are disagree with the teaching methodology and 30.3% are disagree with the experimental learning.

3. The teachers have to use modern teaching aids like PPT, Web-resources and the teachers have to pay attention to the academically weaker students.

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

Profile of the College:

Gossaigaon College is the only institution of higher learning in the Gossaigaon Civil Sub-Division of Kokrajhar District in Assam. Established in the year 1971, Gossaigaon College has progressed by leaps and bounds against heavy odds discharging its sacred mission "to meet the aspirations of higher education of the local people mostly the tribals. to promote women education and to provide science education at minimum costs in order to bring about an alround development of the area as a whole".

The College is located about 50 km away towards the west of Kokrajhar, the Headquarter of Bodoland Territorial Council (BTC) of Assam. The beautiful natural sal trees which stand gloriously by the side of the College provide a peaceful and cordial atmosphere for teaching and learning process.

Thematic Rationale:

Exploitation of Earth's natural resources is currently an essential condition of human existence. However, accelerated economic growth with high consumption level in developed countries and aspirations of developing countries to reach matching levels of growth are continuing to damage our Planet Earth's environment. As Earth's ecosystems are disrupted, we face the loss of ecosystem services: the benefits humans receive from healthy ecosystems (e.g. clean drinking water, crop pollination, recreational spaces). India is one of the fastest growing economies of the world and will continue its widespread and rapid urbanization and industrialization often compels planners to overlook the importance of maintaining a natural balance in environment. The unbridled economic development have resulted ecological imbalance with disastrous fallouts such as deleting natural resources, degraded land, disappearing forests, endangered species, dangerous toxins, global warming etc. There should, therefore, be a reasonable compromise between developmental activities and conservation of the environment.

Since long a course of action plan was resolved in Rio-declaration to improve environmental degradation, to reduce the loss of biodiversity and emission of greenhouse gases and to go ahead towards sustainable development. Emission of greenhouse gases from automobiles, power plants etc. is known to be a prime contributor to global warming and climate change. Adaptation and mitigation of this menace is a responsibility not only of individual country or community but calls for consorted action from the International Community. Like all other countries, India needs to find a way to ensure environmental sustainability without compromising its economic and social development. Full Paper Submission:

Full paper of individual paper presenter is to be submitted within the specified date as mentioned below. The full paper for publications should contain Introduction, Review of Literature, Objectives, Methodology, Discussion, Results/Findings, Policy Implications and Conclusion. References should be given at the end of the paper arranged alphabetically by authors, followed by the year of publications, name of the journals, articles or books, etc, name of the publishers, place of publications and relevant pages in succession. Accommodation:

Accommodation could be arranged to the paper presenters on request in Hotels at Gossaigaon, Kokrajhar, Bongaigaon, Coochbehar, Alipurduar and Barovisha, but they will have to bear the expenses. Climate of Gossaigaon in February:

The nearest Airports are Lokapriya Gopinath Bordoloi International Airport, Guwahati and Bagdogra Airport, Siliguri which are not more than two hours journey by air from Delhi. These Airports are also connected to Mumbai, Kolkata, Chennai and other Airports in India and Abroad.

Nearest Railway Stations:

The nearest Railway stations suggested are New Bongaigaon, Kokrajhar, New Coochbehar and New Alipurduar which are well connected with most of the cities and towns in India by trains. Those who want to reach Gossaigaon by train can also avail of Brahamputra Mail, Kanchan Junga Express, Jaja Express, Lumding Intercity, Kamakhya-New Coochbehar Intercity, Dekargaon(Tezpur)-NJP Intercity and Sifung Passenger which have stoppage at Gossaigaon Hat station.

Nearest Bus Stations:

The nearest Bus station is Gossaigaon, in the heart of Gossaigaon town from which buses both private and government run to different parts of Assam and West Bengal like Guwahati, Barpetaroad, Bongaigaon, Kokrajhar, Coochbehar, Alipurduar, Barovisha, etc.
